this wide ranging theme takes braudel s concept of the mediterranean as its starting point braudel s vision of an enclosed sea as a geographical opportunity for economic integration between nations with different religions languages and ethnicities and political bodies still functions as a model for studies on a wide range of contexts the goal of the 50th study week was to go beyond the study of individual systems in isolation and to combine instead different analysis of open and enclosed seas or coastal areas in order to understand the integration role played by maritime connections in europe since in pre industrial civilizations water transport was easier than land transport the time has come to bring attention to the way these relationship networks operated both on a european level and with asian and north african trade partners this volume starts from the great research traditions which have however rarely been integrated on a larger and continental scale and analyses them on either a regional or thematic basis immanuel wallerstein has developed braudel s concept by conceptualising its intercultural and transnational dimensions and its role in the system of labour he called it a world system not because it involves the whole world but because it is larger than any legally defined political unit and it is a world economy because the base link between the different parts of the system has an economic nature the various regional research aspects and traditions have been linked together in a coherent approach which aims at evaluating what geographical nautical technical economic legal social and cultural elements influenced the emergence of the various regional networks and how these worked the nature and role of seaports as nodal points of sea routes and of their hinterland through rivers canals and roads the commercial and personal ties between merchants and shipowners in various ports how regional networks connected with each other and how over time they ended up integrating into larger units how private networks initially between merchant and seafarer organizations ended up dealing with local authorities and after their growth with states and empires in order to protect their interests

this edited volume is a sequel to and a development of the long aftermath cultural legacies of europe at war 1936-2016. it focuses on the six major european countries and states that remained officially neutral throughout the second world war namely ireland portugal spain sweden switzerland and the vatican. its transnational comparative and interdisciplinary approach addresses complex questions pertaining to collective remembrance national policies and politics and intellectual as well as cultural responses to neutrality during and after the conflict. the contributions are from a broad range of scholars working across the disciplines of history literature film media and cultural studies. their thought provoking chapters challenge many assumptions about neutrality in the post war european and global context thereby filling a gap in the existing scholarship. common themes that run through the volume include the intertwined and dynamic links between neutrality and moral responsibility during and after the second world war the importance of memory politics and popular culture in shaping collective memories and the impact of the holocaust in shifting traditional perspectives on neutrality. since the 1990s this volume will be of interest to undergraduates postgraduates scholars interested in the field of memory studies as well as non specialist readers.

In the Axis war on the side of Germany Mussolini's Italy was responsible for serious war crimes especially in Yugoslavia and Greece this dark side of the fascist war however is not present in the national memory built after 1945 to distinguish Italy from the former German ally and avoid a punitive peace the monarchist and anti-fascist ruling classes elaborated a master narrative that highlighted the opposition of the Italian people to Mussolini's war and the humanitarian behavior of Italian soldiers depicted as saviors of Jews all responsibility for the crimes committed in the Axis war was placed on the shoulders of the Germans who thus became a convenient alibi for the national conscience

jews in japan presence and perception antisemitism philosemitism and international relations is a study on the history of real and imagined jews in japan which discusses the little known cultural political and economic ties between jews and japan and follows the evolution of jewish stereotypes in japan in the last century and a half the book begins with the arrival of jews and their image in late 19th to early 20th century japan when the seeds of later stereotyped visions were sown the discussion then focuses on wartime japan delving into the complex and mixed attitudes of the japanese empire toward jews in postwar japan the partial reception of the holocaust intertwined with earlier antisemitic and philosemitic manifestations resulting in instances of both hatred and admiration toward jews finally the book explores the recent reframing of japanese jewish historical encounters within the context of the growing ties between japan and israel this study sheds new light on the little explored relations between jews and japan offering thought provoking insights into the coexistence of antisemitism and philosemitism the political and diplomatic uses of jewish history and the perpetuation of jewish stereotypes in a land devoid of a local jewish population

while hagiographies tell of christian martyrs who have died in an astonishing number of ways and places slain by members of many different groups martyrdom in a franciscan context generally meant death at muslim hands indeed in franciscan discourse death by saracen came to rival or even surpass other definitions of what made a martyr the centrality of islam to franciscan conceptions of martyrdom becomes even more apparent and problematic when we realize that many of the martyr narratives were largely invented franciscan authors were free to choose the antagonist they wanted christopher macevitt observes and they almost always chose muslims however martyrdom in franciscan accounts rarely leads to conversion of the infidel nor is it accompanied as is so often the case in earlier hagiographical accounts by any miraculous manifestation if the importance of preaching to infidels was written into the official franciscan rule of order the order did not demonstrate much interest in conversion and the primary efforts of friars in muslim lands were devoted to preaching not to the native populations but to the latin christians mercenaries merchants and captives living there franciscan attitudes toward conversion and martyrdom changed dramatically in the beginning of the fourteenth century however when accounts of the martyrdom of four franciscans said to have died while preaching in india were written the speed with which the accounts of their martyrdom spread had less to do with the world beyond christendom than with ecclesiastical affairs within macevitt contends the martyrdom of the franciscans shows how for franciscans martyrdom accounts could at once offer veiled critique of papal policies toward the order a substitute for the rigorous pursuit of poverty and a symbolic way to overcome islam by denying muslims the solace of conversion
