of many of those final speeches including king charles i s 1649 archbishop william laud s 1645 and the earl of strafford s 1641 as well as those of less well known royalists and regicides where we situate ourselves to view hear and comprehend a public execution through specific participants eyes ears and minds or accounts shapes our interpretation of the ritual it is impossible to achieve a singular carefully indoctrinated meaning of an event as complex as a state sponsored public execution along with the variety of voices and meanings the nature and purpose of the rituals of justice maintain a significant amount of consistency in a number of eras and cultural contexts whether the focus is on the trial and execution of the marian martyrs english royalists in the 1640s and 1650s or the restoration s regicides the events draw on a set of cultural expectations or conventions because rituals of justice are shaped by diverse voices and agendas with the participants scripts and counterscripts converging and colliding they are dramatic moments conveying profound meanings published by university of delaware press distributed worldwide by rutgers university press

in his final speech i ve been to the mountaintop martin luther king jr delivered his support of african american garbage workers on strike in memphis although some consider this oration king s finest it is mainly known for its concluding two minutes wherein king compares himself to moose and seems to predict his own assassination but king gave an hour long speech and the concluding segment can only be understood in relation to the whole king scholars generally focus on his theology not his relation to the bible or the circumstance of a baptist speaking in a pentecostal setting even though king cited and explicated the bible in hundreds of speeches and sermons martin luther king s biblical epic is the first book to analyze his approach to the bible and its importance to his rhetoric and persuasiveness martin luther king s biblical epic argues that king challenged dominant christian supersessionist conceptions of judaism in favor of a christianity that affirms judaism as its wellspring in his final speech king implicitly but strongly argues that one can grasp jesus only by first grasping moose and the hebrew prophets this book also traces the roots of king s speech to its pentecostal setting and to the pentecostals in his audience in doing so miller puts forth the first scholarship to credit the mostly unknown but brilliant african american architect who created the large yet compact church sanctuary which made possible the unique connection between king and his audience on the night of his last speech

this book discusses the revolutionary broadening of concepts of freedom of press and freedom of speech in great britain and in america in the late eighteenth century in the period that produced state declarations of rights and then the first amendment and fox s libel act the conventional view of the history of freedoms of press and speech is that the common law since antiquity defined those freedoms narrowly and that sir william blackstone in 1769 and lord chief justice mansfield in 1770 faithfully summarized the common law in giving a very narrow definition of those freedoms as mere liberty from prior restraint and not liberty from punishment after something was printed or spoken this book proposes to the contrary that blackstone carefully selected the narrowest definition that had been suggested in popular essays in the prior seventy years in order to oppose the growing claims for much broader protections of press and speech blackstone misdescribed his summary as an accepted common law definition which in fact did not exist a year later mansfield inserted a similar definition into the common law for the first time also misdescribing it as a long accepted definition and soon misdescribed the unique rules for prosecuting sedition as having an equally ancient pedigree blackstone and mansfield were not declaring the law as it had long been but were leading a counter revolution about the breadth of freedoms of press and speech and cloaking it as a summary of a narrow common law doctrine that in fact was nonexistent that conflict of revolutionary view and counter revolutionary view continues today for over a century a neo blackstonian view has been dominant or at least very influential among historians contrary to those narrow claims this book concludes that the broad understanding of freedoms of press and speech was the dominant context of the first amendment and of fox s libel act and that it enjoyed greater historical support
