intimate love opens us up to suffering sacrifice and loss is it always worth the risk consulting philosophers writers and poets who draw insights from material life diane enns shines a light on the limits of erotic love exploring its paradoxes through personal and philosophical reflections situating experience at the center of her inquiry enns conducts philosophy by another name elaborating the ambiguities and risks of love with visceral clarity love in the dark claims that intimacy must accept risk as long as love does not destroy the self erotic love inspires an inexplicable affirmation of another but can erode autonomy and vulnerability there is a limit to love and appreciating it requires a rethinking of love s liberal paradigms which enns traces back to the hostility toward the body and eros in christianity and the western philosophical tradition against a legacy of an abstract and sanitized love enns recasts erotic attachment as an event linked to conditional circumstances the value of love lies in its intensity and depth and its end does not negate love s truth or significance writing in a lyrical genre defying style enns delineates the paradoxes of love in its relations to lust abuse suffering and grief to reach an account faithful to human experience

luis buñuel 1900 1983 was one of the truly great film makers of the twentieth century shaped by a repressive jesuit education and a bourgeois family background he reacted against both escaped to paris and was soon embraced by andré breton s official surrealist group his early films are his most aggressive and shocking the slicing of the eyeball in un chien andalou 1929 one of the most memorable episodes in the history of cinema the forgotten ones 1950 and he 1952 made in mexico were followed from 1960 in spain and france by the films for which he is best known viridiana 1961 belle de jour 1966 tristana 1970 the discreet charm of the bourgeoisie 1972 and that obscure object of desire 1977 gwynne edwards analyses the films in the context of buñuel s personal obsessions sex bourgeois values and religion suggesting that the film maker experienced a degree of sexual inhibition surprising in a surrealist gwynne edwards is professor of spanish at the university of wales aberystwyth

in life destroying diagrams eugenie brinkema brings the insights of her radical formalism to bear on supremely risky terrain the ethical extremes of horror and love through close readings of works of film literature and philosophy she explores how diagrams grids charts lists abecedaria toroids tempos patterns colors negative space lengths increments and thresholds attest to formal logics of torture and cruelty violence and finitude friendship and eros debt and care beginning with a wholesale rethinking of the affect of horror orienting it away from entrenched models of feeling toward impersonal schemes and structures brinkema moves outward to consider the relation between objects and affects humiliation and metaphysics genre and the general bodily destruction and aesthetic generation geometry and scenography hatred and value love and measurement and ultimately the tensions hazards and speculative promise of formalism itself replete with etymological meditations performative typography and lyrical digressions life destroying diagrams is at once a model of reading without guarantee and a series of generative experiments in the writing of aesthetic theory

the shadow and its shadow is a classic collection of writings by the surrealists on their mad love of moviegoing the forty odd theoretical polemical and poetical re visions of the seventh art in this anthology document surrealism s scandalous and nonreductive take on film writing between 1918 and 1977 the essayists include such names as andré breton louis aragon robert desnos salvador dalí luis buñuel and man ray as well as many of the less famous though equally fascinating figures of the movement paul hammond s introduction limns the history of surrealist cinemania highlighting how these revolutionary poets artists and philosophers sifted the silt of commercial often hollywood cinema for the odd fleck of gold the windfall movie that somehow slipping past the censor questioned the dominant order such prospecting pivoted around the notion of lyrical behavior as depicted on the screen and as lived in the movie house the representation of such behavior led the surrealists to valorize the manifest content of such denigrated genres as silent and sound comedy romantic melodrama film noir horror movies as to lived experience moviegoing surrealists looked to the spectacle s latent meaning reading films as the unwitting providers of redemptive sequences that could be mentally clipped out of their narrative context and inserted into daily life there to provoke new adventures hammond s book is a reminder of the wealth and range of surrealist writings on the cinema t he work represented here is still challenging and genuinely eccentric locating itself in an ethic of love reverie and revolt sight sound hammond who is the author of the invaluable anthology the shadow and its shadow surrealist writing on the cinema 1978 writes about cinema independently of the changing academic and cultural fashions of film theory and abhors the dogmas of contemporary border patrol thought his magnetically appealing free wheeling form of erudite film critical writing is recognisable for its iconoclastic humour non authoritarian verve and playful witty discursivity john conomos senses of cinema paul hammond is a writer editor and translator living in barcelona he is the author of constellations of miró breton which was published by city lights
