The Sixth Language 2004

in the claim of language christopher fynsk clearly and eloquently defends and rearticulates the humanities from a perspective that moves beyond the political and philosophical reductions of identity politics leaving aside polemics fynsk asserts that discourses in the humanities will find real ethical political purchase when they engage with the material events in art literature and social life that call for humanistic reflection

Standard Albanian 1982

this is the third essay of stefan zweig s three masters balzac dickens dostoevsky written in the early 20th century part biography part literary criticism part cultural history the essay offers a window onto how a central european regarded the russian master who died in 1881 the year zweig was born dostoevsky s genius in zweig s view owed a debt to his illness as tolstoy s did to his radiant health illness enabled dostoevsky to soar upward into a sphere of such concentrated feeling as is rarely experienced by normal men it permitted him to penetrate into the underworld of the emotions into the submerged regions of the psyche this essay is one of the best examples of zweig s psychologically informed literary criticism

Mont-Oriol 1917

a global chronological approach to art history which presents each world culture in its order of appearance reintroducing it when it enters a new phase or merges with other traditions

Ylli 1968

when it was first published in the author s native country the palace of dreams was immediately banned the novel revolves around a secret ministry whose task is not just to spy on its citizens but to collect and interpret their dreams an entire nation s unconscious is thus tapped and meticulously laid bare in the form of images and symbols of the dreaming mind

Tom Brown's School Days 1886

sociology of discourse takes the perspective that collective actors like social movements are capable of creating social change from below by creating new institutions through alternative discourses institutionalization becomes a process of moving away from existing institutions towards creating new ones while discourses entail openness and enable the questioning of what is instituted institutions offer continuity and stability to social mobilizations this dual movement of openness and stabilization explains how social struggles ensure their continuity without completely assuming the logic of the dominant order the book proposes an analytical model of social change which is unfolded through three intertwined areas discourse communication and institution collective experiences of social change from the anti globalization movement to occupy illustrate the main theoretical points and concepts through the example of the platform for people affected by mortgages the book concludes by analyzing how social change from below is possible

Gjurmime albanologjike 1975

this latest offering from one of the founding figures of postmodernism is a collection of fifteen fables that ask in the words of jean francois lyotard how to live and why here lyotard provides a mixture of anarchistic irreverence and sober philosophical reflection on a wide range of topics with attention to issues of justice and ethics aesthetics and judgment in sections titled verbiages system fantasies concealments and crypts lyotard unravels and reconfigures idealist notions subjects as various and fascinating as the french revolution the holocaust the reception of french theory in the anglo american world the events of may 1968 the gulf war academic travelers as intellectual tourists the collapse of communism and his own work in the context of others

Dostoevsky by Zweig 2019-08-16

it s the 1930s christine a young austrian woman whose family has been impoverished by the war toils away in a provincial post office out of the blue a telegram arrives from an american aunt she s never known inviting her to spend two weeks in a grand hotel in a fashionable swiss resort she accepts and is swept up into a world of almost inconceivable wealth and unleashed desire where she allows herself to be utterly transformed then just as abruptly her aunt cuts her loose and she has to return to the post office where yes nothing will ever be the same

Art Past, Art Present 1997

now available in paper the ivory tower and harry potter is the first book length analysis of j k rowling s work from a broad range of perspectives within literature folklore psychology sociology and popular culture a significant portion of the book explores the harry potter series literary ancestors including magic and fantasy works by ursula k leguin monica furlong jill murphy and others as well as previous works about the british boarding school experience other chapters explore the moral and ethical dimensions of harry s world including objections to the series raised within some religious circles in her new epilogue lana a whited brings this volume up to date by covering rowling s latest book harry potter and the order of the phoenix

The Palace of Dreams 1919

the concept of disparity has long been a topic of obsession and argument for philosophers but slavoj Žižek would argue that what disparity and negativity could mean might mean and should mean for us and our lives has never been more hotly debated disparities explores contemporary negative philosophies from catherine malabou s plasticity julia kristeva s abjection and robert pippin s self consciousness to the god of negative theology new realisms and post humanism and draws a radical line under them instead of establishing a dialogue with these other ideas of disparity slavoj Žižek wants to establish a definite departure a totally different idea of disparity based on an imaginative dialectical materialism this notion of rupturing what has gone before is based on a provocative reading of how philosophers can if they re honest engage with each other slavoj Žižek borrows alain badiou s notion that a true idea is the one that divides radically departing from previous formulations of negativity and disparity Žižek employs a new kind of negativity namely positing that when a philosopher deals with another philosopher his or her stance is never one of dialogue but one of division of drawing a line that separates truth from falsity

Albania Past and Present 2012-09-16

modern history is haunted by the disasters of the century world wars concentration camps hiroshima and the holocaust grief anger terror and loss beyond words but still close still impending how can we write or think about disaster when by its very nature it defies speech and compels silence burns books and shatters meaning the writing of the disaster reflects upon efforts to abide in disaster s infinite threat first published in french in 1980 it takes up the most serious tasks of writing to describe explain and redeem when possible and to admit what is not possible neither offers consolation maurice blanchot has been praised on both sides of the atlantic for his fiction and criticism the philosopher emmanuel levinas once remarked that blanchot s writing is a language of pure transcendence without correlative literary theorist and critic geoffrey hartman remarked that blanchot s influence on contemporary writers cannot be overestimated
