the history of the florentine patriciate did not end with the establishment of the medici duchy and grand duchy of tuscan proud and self confident these patricians were not subservient courtiers on the contrary they continued to exert a considerable influence on florentine culture and politics for centuries the patrician class in sixteenth century florence were the descendants of wealthy sophisticated and politically savvy families who while acquiring noble titles estates and villas retained their long standing urban identity the mark they left on the city s cultural and artistic life was embraced by the medici who used their political and diplomatic knowhow elaborate artistic commissions and european networks to enhance their power and prestige a cultural symbiosis highlights the contributions to florentine art and culture of eight patricians focusing on the valori pucci ridolfi vecchietti del nero salviati guicciardini and niccolini families

a quick internet search will yield results of leonardo da vinci s legendary paintings the mona lisa and the last supper and you might even catch a glimpse of his well known sketches of machines human bodies and animals however there s so much more to da vinci than his paintings and drawings this 16th century italian man embodied the renaissance spirit he was intensely interested in everyone and everything his curiosity spanned every discipline from geometry to anatomy to the link between art and science 500 years ago was a time of insight of investigation and in this sense da vinci fit in perfectly however in another sense he didn t belong at all he was a loner living in his own world an illegitimate child with 17 half siblings leonardo also shrouded himself in secrecy he wrote in a mirror script meaning that you could only understand what he had written by holding it up to a mirror he believed that we all have potential to do amazing things but he also had lots of unfinished projects and struggled with lifelong self doubt delve in to these pages to find out why leonardo di ser piero d antonio di ser piero di ser guido da vinci yes this was his full name was as mysterious as his

this book takes a new look at the interpretations of and the historical information surrounding michelangelo s david new documentary materials discovered by rolf bagemihl add to the early history of the stone block that became the david and provide an identity for the painted terracotta colossus that stood on the cathedral buttresses for which michelangelo s statue was to be a companion the david with its placement at the palazzo della signoria was deeply implicated in the civic history of florence where public nakedness played a ritual role in the military and in the political lives of its people this book then places the david not only within the artistic history of florence and its monuments but also within the popular culture of the period as well

## ***The Lira Da Braccio***

in this book which was originally published in 2005 amanda lillie challenges the urban bias in renaissance art and architectural history by investigating the architecture and patronage strategies particularly those of the strozzi and the sassetti clans in the florentine countryside during the fifteenth century based entirely on archival material that remained unpublished at the time of publication her book examines a number of villas from this period and reconstructs the value systems that emerge from these sources which defy the traditional idealized interpretation of the renaissance villa here the house is studied in relation to the families who lived in them and to the land that surrounded them the villa emerges as a functional utilitarian farming unit upon whose success families depended and where dynastic and patrimonial values could be nurtured
